We are seeking to strengthen what we have and expand to more events and community-building. A successful candidate will integrate themselves into the life of the church including worship, fellowship and missions.

The Christian Education and Youth Group Leader will report to the Interim Senior Pastor. S/he will work with and be supported by the Board of Christian Education and the Youth Ministry Committee. Goal-setting and evaluation will be collaborative through a Ministry Team designated for this role.

Primary responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Create and lead regular children and family events with a faith, mission and fellowship focus;
- Create and lead regular youth group events with a mission and fellowship focus;
- Recruit and equip volunteers to join and support these ministries;
- Participate in monthly meetings of Christian Education Board and Youth Ministry Committee;
- Participate in weekly staff meetings;
- Adhere to Safe Sanctuary Statement of Policy.

Core Competencies include but not limited to:

- Commitment to the church and all it has to offer;
- Enjoy working with children, youth and families;
- Excellent interpersonal skills with people of all ages;
- Excellent communication skills, both verbal and written, with consistent follow-up;
- Strong organizational skills while focusing on multiple projects.
